#2 Coach Certification Guidelines for 2019-2020

A second coach may be selected as a PD opportunity (succession planning). Coaches applying under this heading should state their experience and future coaching aspirations.

- 3) Professional Development opportunities for coaches
- 4) Mentoring opportunities for younger coaches
- 5) Coaches must be current and certified with CSC before applying

Full Day On-Snow Honorarium Scale:

EL Trained: \$100

EL Certified: \$120

DL Trained: \$140

DL Certified: \$160

PL Trained: \$180

PL Certified: \$200

Honorariums are generally only payable for days on snow with athletes. The only exception would be if a coach is travelling with multiple athletes without a parent.

Coach Athlete Ratio: Recommended maximum 1:6 at any event

Coaches Expenses:

The following coach's expenses for these team events will be covered: travel, accommodations, meals & lift tickets. Please note that meals will be covered while travelling. All coach expenses will be evaluated by the team administrator. At the venue coaches are expected to eat with the athletes when possible.

Please use the attached expense form to submit all expenses.

COACH RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Coaches' primary role is to train and coach the athletes
- Coaches will not share rooms with athlete(s) unless they have an athlete that is a son or daughter
- Coaches of opposite gender may share a room at their discretion
- A coach will not be directly responsible for athletes off-hill, but they are expected to assist the chaperones with supervision of the athletes. Coaches will be responsible for discipline of the athletes.
- Coaches are expected to have a meeting with the athletes at the end of each day.
- Coaches are to use ACA points as the criteria for seeding athletes in each discipline.
- Coaches are to act as an advocate for the athletes (tuning, nutrition, etc)
- Coaches must treat all athletes equitably in training, race environments and all off-hill activities.
- Be knowledgeable about appropriate local, National, and International rules that govern alpine ski racing
- Attend all mandatory seminars, meetings and functions
- Manage all athlete goal setting/evaluation procedures; maintain athlete competition and results profile
- Be responsible for inventory of all race/program equipment (drills, gates, spare parts, bits, radios, tool kits, wax, etc.)
- Assess the athlete's equipment; help athletes/families find access to the best possible equipment for them; instruct athletes in proper tuning and equipment maintenance
- Create/manage athlete/parent information packages
- Prepare all post-race reports and evaluations
- Prepare individual athlete emergency plans
