The Alpine Level 2 Officials course provides training on the rules and operations of alpine ski racing, preparing an official for supervisory positions at a competition. This course covers the following areas of officiating:

- 1. Structures: governing bodies, alpine events, International Competition Rules (ICR), race organization
- 2. Processes: phases of a race from preparation to wrap-up (including review of a competitor's run from start to finish), and race operations
- Roles: Chief Gate Judge, Start Referee, Finish Referee, Race Administrator, Referee, Coach at a competition

There will be homework assignments to prepare for each session. The one-hour open-book exam (70% on final exam to pass the course) will take place during the last session. Supporting materials for the course include the FIS Alpine ICR, ACA Alpine Officials Manual, and Level 2 Student Workbook.

This course is delivered online in 4 parts (note the sessions may be recorded). Prepare the following for the best online participation:

- stable internet connection
- headset/earbuds with built-in microphone
- webcam
- quiet location

The online meeting link will be open ten minutes before the start of each session to allow participants to set up and test their audio/visual. The sessions will begin on time.
